2017 ANNUAL REPORT

The **Cowichan Therapeutic Riding Association** provides equine-based wellness programs for persons with disabilities. CTRA serves as a community hub of inclusion and a catalyst for human potential, enriching the lives of countless individuals and supporting key social determinants of health in our community.

The association began in 1986 with a handful of volunteers, horses borrowed from the community, and an arena rented one night per week. Today, CTRA's multifaceted 6-days-a-week program welcomes hundreds each year and ranks as a national leader in the field.

ACTIVITY SUMMARY

The number of unique participants increased by 8% in 2017. The group method of CTRA's adapted equestrian vaulting service allows CTRA to accommodate additional participants with fewer resources due to a higher participant-to-horse ratio.

The number of participants referred to the program for mental health reasons (as either a primary or secondary diagnosis) continues to climb. **In 2017, mental health challenges comprised 67% of referrals**, an increase from 61% in 2016.

In response to this trend, CTRA instituted a "secondary" referral system in 2017 that allows educators, counsellors, social workers and other community navigators to refer participants to equine therapy for psycho-social concerns.

LOOKING FORWARD: CTRA will continue to respond to the growing demand within our community for mental health services (within our purview) from those suffering from anxiety, PTSD, and more.

REVENUE & SUSTAINABILITY

CTRA dove into social enterprise head first in 2017! The Jane James Used Tack Store opened in 2011. In 2016 the store was selected as a winner of the seCatalyst awards - an Island-wide Dragon's Den style competition

recognizing exceptional social enterprises. In 2017, the renovation of the old Piggery building allowed for an expansion of this business, bringing with it an increase in publicity, traffic and sales.

In 2017, CTRA's self-generated income (including user fees, fundraising, and social enterprise) accounted for 33% of the organizations revenue. The percentage of this income derived from social enterprise through the Jane James Used Tack Shop

has risen 3% from 2016.

LOOKING FORWARD: An extremely generous inventory donation from Casagrande's Pets Plus, combined with increased visibility in the community, will boost the Tack Shop's sales for 2018.





We're taking it on the road! **The "Coastal Tack Shack" was completed in 2017** thanks to support from Coastal Community Credit Union. This mobile kiosk is equipped with retail fixtures and loaded with used tack inventory from the Jane James Used Tack Shop, and can be set up at equine shows and events to expand our retail reach.



LOOKING FORWARD: The Coastal Tack Shack will be visiting a host of horse shows, fairs, and other community events in 2018 with the aim of increasing Tack Shop revenue and raising the visibility of CTRA's programs.






COMMUNITY COLLABORATIONS

In 2017, CTRA collaborated with the Hiiye'yu Lelum (House of Friendship) Society to integrate an equine-therapy component into an early parenting course for Aboriginal mothers. The group learned various aspects of horsemanship while a comfortable baby-minding space was made available for the participant's little ones.







A partnership was also formed with West Coast Vaulters (A Parksville-based Equestrian Vaulting group), funded by the Canadian Tire Jumpstart Program. This collaboration helps CTRA's participants access upper-level vaulting horses and instruction, and provides a wonderful professional development opportunity for CTRA instructors.

LOOKING FORWARD: Researchers from the University of Victoria's School of Exercise Science, Physical and Health Education will be undertaking 2 research projects to a) document the physical demands of adapted equestrian vaulting and b) examine CTRA's role in helping the social connectedness of families who attend the program regularly.



PERFORMANCE



CTRA riders were on the podium as they cleaned up on the fourth and final leg of the 2017 Para-Equestrian Video Competition Series. CTRA riders compete under the Sea-to-Sea Para-Dressage Program, an inclusive, multi-level competition which invites riders from across Canada to submit video entries of "tests" (pre-determined patterns demonstrating graduated skills) which are judged against riders classified within the same grade (grades are based on functional abilities such as muscle power, joint range and coordination).

Video competitions are an innovative solution that allows riders with special needs to experience the thrill of national competition within the supportive environment of their home centre (using familiar volunteer teams, dedicated therapy horses, and specialized tack) and without the prohibitive expense of travel.

Nine CTRA riders competed, with 5 achieving first place in their grade! These latest achievements clinched CTRA the title of High Point Therapeutic Riding Centre for the 2017 Sea-to Sea Competition! This is the second year in a row that CTRA has been honoured with this distinction.
